Dr. Trehan is trained in both pediatric emergency medicine and pediatric infectious diseases and sees patients at St. Louis Children's Hospital. He has also worked with Partners in Health in Haiti and as clinical lead of their Ebola Treatment Unit in Port Loko, Sierra Leone. He spends most of his professional time studying childhood malnutrition and infections in Malawi, where he also sees patients at Kamuzu Central Hospital and in a network of rural clinics throughout southern Malawi.

His research has been published in numerous prestigious journals, including The New England Journal of Medicine, Science, Nature, PNAS, BMJ, Pediatrics, PLoS Medicine, and The American Journal of Clinical Nutrition. His research on the use of antibiotics in severely malnourished children was featured on the front page of The New York Times and was instrumental in the development of the 2013 World Health Organization guidelines on the management of severe acute malnutrition.

In addition to his research, he continues to be an active clinical teacher in both St. Louis and Malawi, having won numerous teaching awards and serving as the director of the Pediatric Global Health Residency Pathway at Washington University in St. Louis.
