Dr. Lynn Black is a Physician Director for Network Development and Integration at Massachusetts General Hospital. She is on the clinical staff of the Department of Medicine and on the faculty of Harvard Medical School, and currently serves as the Chief Medical Officer of the International Medical and Surgical Response Team East for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

After completing her Master's degree in Public Health Policy and medical education at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, she did her residency in Internal Medicine at The New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center.

Dr. Black's clinical experience has been in both Emergency Medicine and Internal Medicine. Dr. Black's international work includes a variety of projects involving women's health and gender based violence, access to care, and disaster relief for academic institutions, FEMA, and non-governmental organizations. She has worked on projects in Haiti, Liberia, Chad, Belize, Dominican Republic, Grenada, Guam, and Micronesia. She also serves on the Massachusetts General Hospital Ethics Committee and as an evaluator for asylum seekers with Physicians for Human Rights.

Dr. Black holds a BS in Nursing from the University of Vermont, an MD/MPH from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and completed her Internal Medicine Residency at Cornell New York Hospital.
