

Sol Stern, MD, MSc, BSc, MCFP



Dr. Sol Stern obtained his Doctor of Medicine from the University of Toronto in 1982 after obtaining a B.Sc. and M.Sc. at the same university. He started a family medicine practice in Oakville, Ontario in 1983 and has been practicing in Oakville ever since.

Dr. Stern spends about 1/4 of his time involved in Continuing Medical Education (CME) and has developed and collaborated on many CME workshops including the topics of cardiovascular disease, stroke, depression, and chronic non-cancer and cancer related pain management.

Dr. Stern was the Medical Director of Hope House, a residential facility that provided care to teenage girls who required temporary residence due to family issues. Dr. Stern was Medical Director of Muskoka Woods, a high end summer camp that also provides free access to a significant number of children who could not otherwise afford camp. Included in the camp were children from First Nations.

Dr. Stern and his wife, Janet, are associated with "Kerr Street Ministries" an agency in Oakville, Ontario that provides food and support for many impoverished families including refugees. Through this ministry, Dr. Stern has been given the opportunity to provide medical care for families that have emigrated from places like Columbia and Cuba.
